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1 Introduction

This document is written for the following users of the Committee Internal Voting system (see the definition of the different roles in **1.3.4**):

- **Vote Owner**
- **Voter**
- **Commenter**
- **Administrator**

For each chapter of this document, the roles concerned by the explanation will be indicated as follows:

- **[All]** : concern all the roles
- **[Vote Owner]** : only concern the Vote Owner
- **[Voter]** : only concern the Voter
- **[Commenter]** : only concerns the Commenter
- **[Administrators]** : only concerns the Administrators

1.1 Committee internal voting workflow

The CIV voting process and its follow-up are characterized by the following main stages:

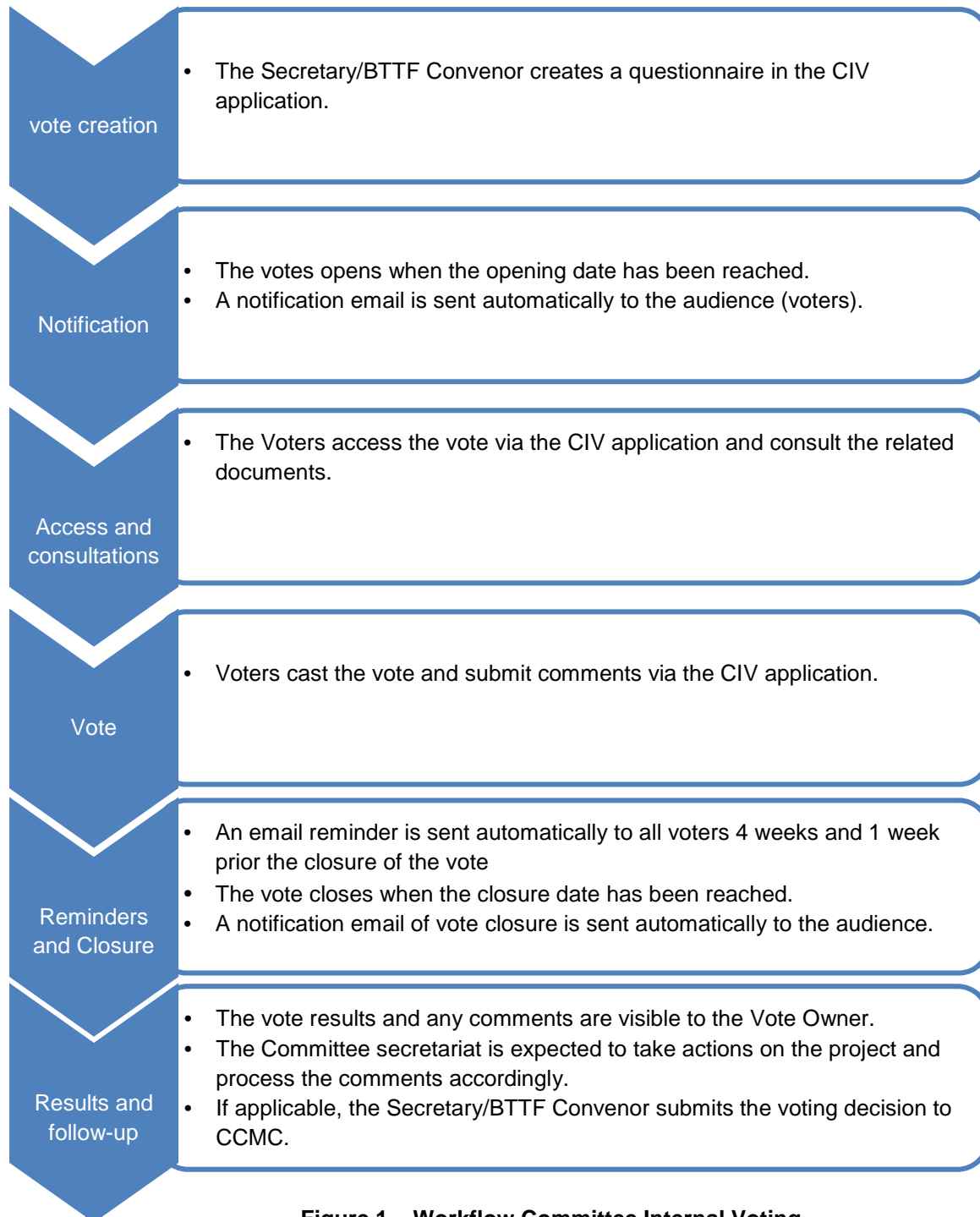


Figure 1 – Workflow Committee Internal Voting

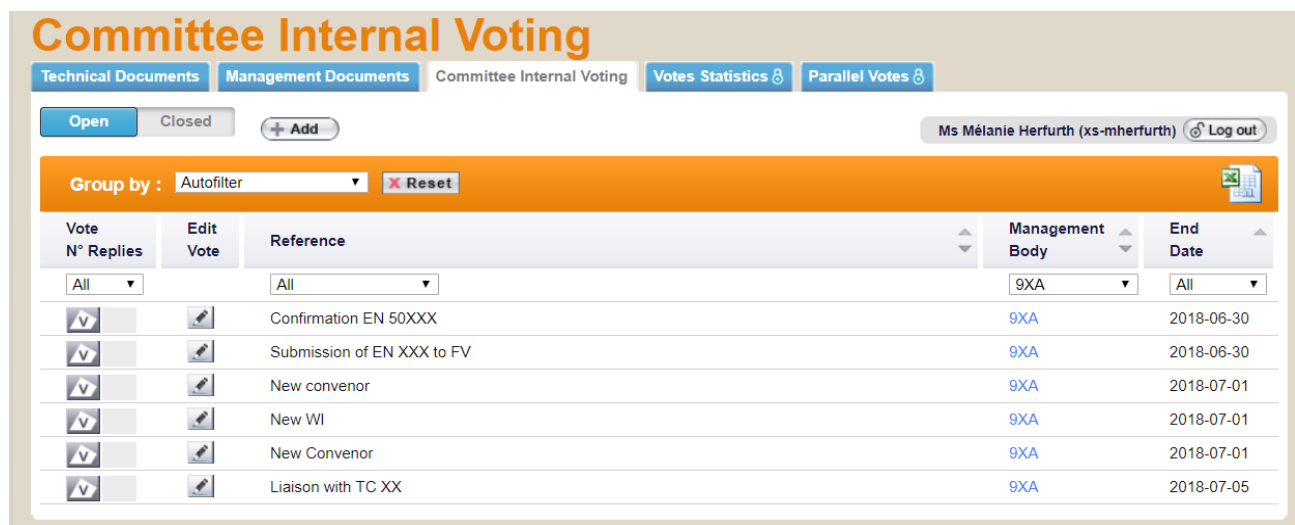


Figure 2 – Electronic voting application overview

1.3 Principles of the Electronic voting application

1.3.1 Permissions to vote and comment

- Authorized to **cast votes** (with associated comments if needed) are the representatives of **CENELEC National Committees** in the Technical Body, defined as **CIV Voters** in the **Expert Management System (EMS)**. CENELEC National Committees can also define a person as **CIV Voter** for all the Technical Bodies (in such case this person will receive systematically the voting rights when a new TC is created).
- Authorized to **submit comments** are the representatives of **external liaison organizations** as well as CENELEC Consultants.

1.3.2 Management of users and their voting roles

Voters are registered in **EMS** in the roles of CIV voters. Users and their roles are registered and maintained by the user administrators of CENELEC National Committees in **EMS**.

Commenters are registered in **EMS** in the roles of CIV commenters. Users and their roles are registered and maintained by CCMC in EMS.

Any changes in user data and role assignments relevant for CIV voting are reflected the following day in the access permissions.

1.3.3 Voting rights on all Technical Bodies or on specific Technical Bodies

- **All Technical Bodies:** In this type of voting, one or more individuals vote on all votes issued by all Technical Bodies.

- **Specific Technical Bodies:** The responsibility to vote is decentralized for each Technical Body or sets of Bodies to different individuals, who can only vote on Technical Bodies for which they have been assigned the role of voters.

The assignment of users is done by the user administrators of each CENELEC National Committee.

1.3.4 Committee Internal Voting roles

On various screens and explanations some terms are used in relation to roles in the voting process with which you may not be familiar. The table below gives an overview and explanations of these terms and relates it to business functions in CENELEC. Note that each role can be assumed by more than one individual for any given vote.

voting roles	Role definitions	Permissions
Vote Owner	Responsible to initiate and run the voting process. This role is assumed by the Secretary (Technical Committee Secretary, SR Secretary, Subcommittee Secretary or BTTF Convenor) . The role of vote owner is not defined as such in EMS, access to the related permissions for the corresponding Technical Body will systematically be given to the relevant role	Can create CIV of the respective Technical Body(ies), has full access to the Technical Body internal voting environment. A Vote Owner has also the permission to register a vote in the voting application on behalf of a Voter (if required).
Voter	User authorized to vote on behalf of his/her national member organization.	Can vote inside a particular Technical Body.
Commenter	Person representing an organization who has no right to vote, but can submit a comment.	Can comment inside a particular Technical Body.
Administrator	This role will be covered by the CCMC EMS administrator.	The permissions is identical to the Vote Owner with the difference that it is extended to all Technical Bodies without restriction.

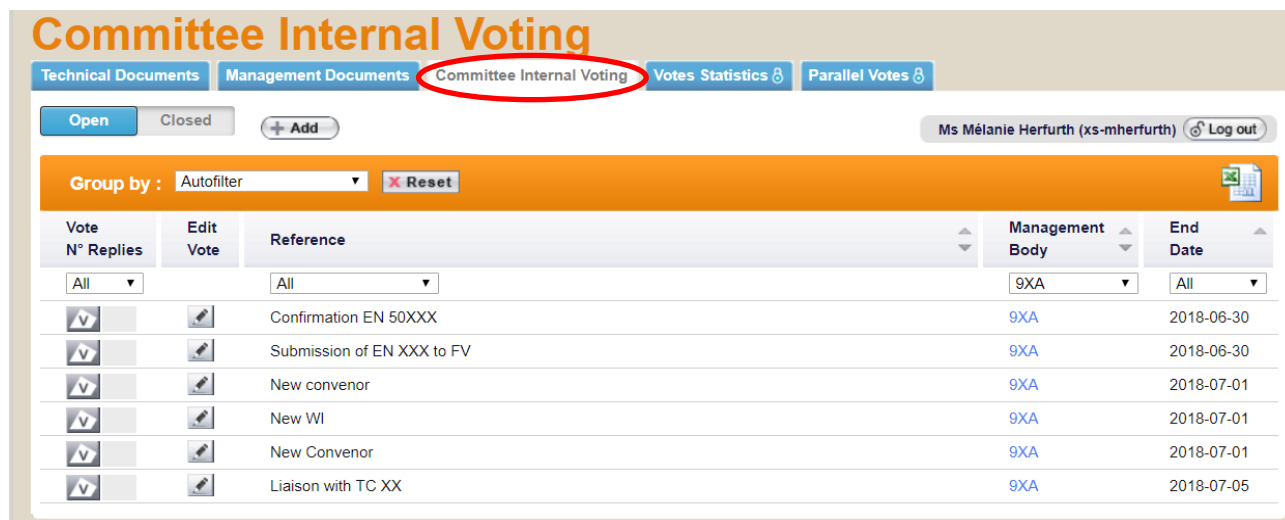


Figure 5 – Electronic Voting page

2 Logging in and logging out

2.1 Logging in

Your username and password will be sent to you by e-mail after your initial registration by your National Committee in **EMS** and to the CENELEC eServices (e.g. Committee Internal Voting).

- Navigate from the CENELEC Website to the Electronic Voting Portal
- Click on **LOG IN to VOTE/COMMENT** or click on the tab Committee Internal Voting

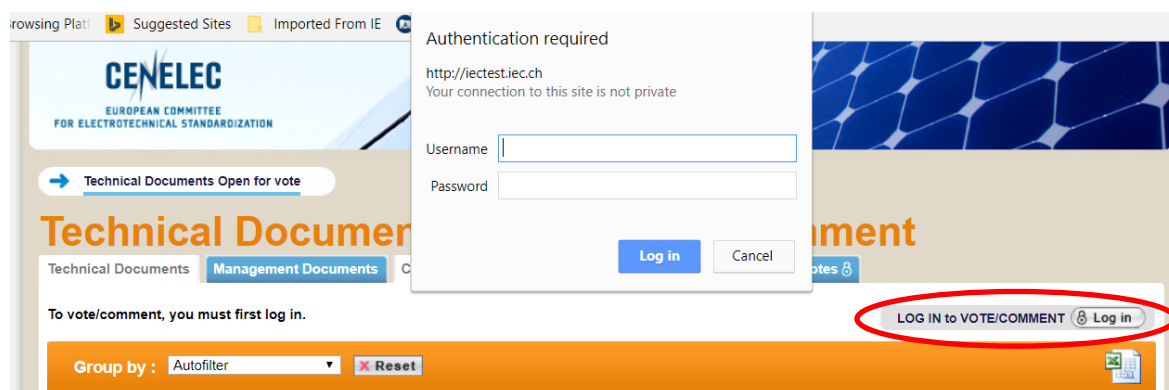


Figure 6 – Login screen in Google Chrome

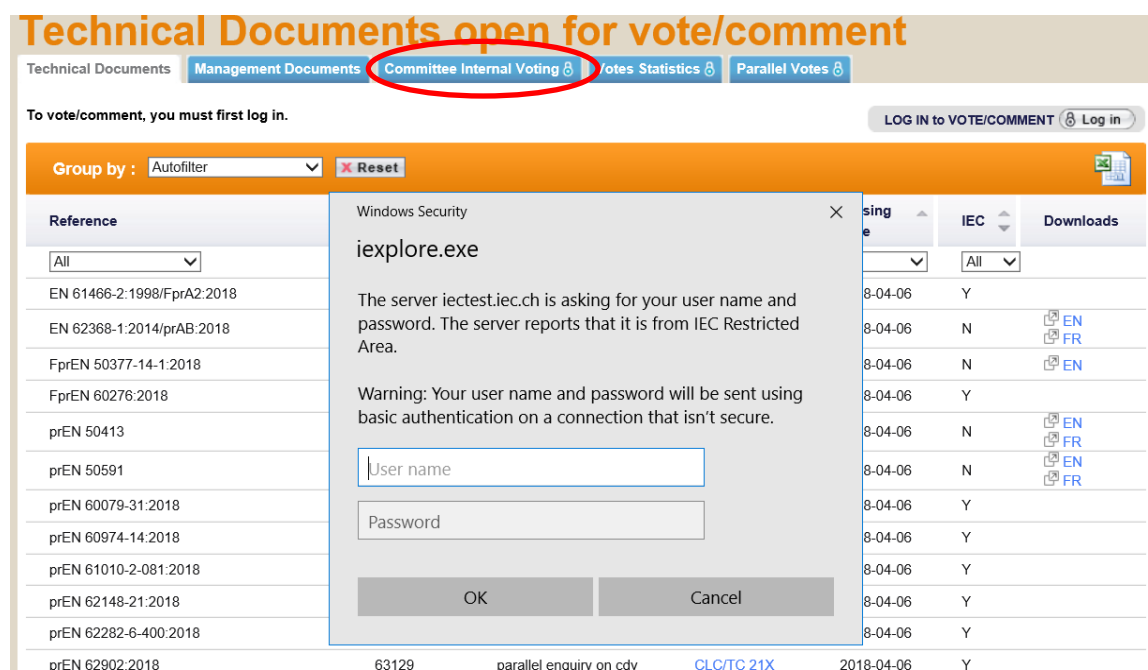


Figure 7 – Login screen in Internet Explorer

Please note that both username and password are case-sensitive, i.e. they have to be entered exactly as provided.

2.2 Logging out

- Click on **Log out** on the **right side** of the screen.
- You will be forwarded to the CENELEC Website.

2.3 Password forgotten

3 User interface and navigation

3.1 CIV Navigation

The **Committee Internal voting tab** displays a list of all currently open votes, which you are allowed to view depending on the roles assigned in EMS (note that the list is different for users performing different roles and/or representing different National Committees).

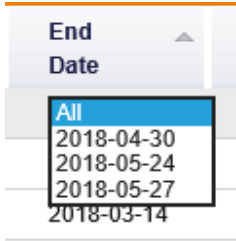
Figure 10 – Committee Internal voting tab



The columns **Reference**, **Management Body** and **End Date** are sortable. By clicking on the arrow at the right of the column heading, the column will be sorted. Clicking a second time will reverse the sort.

Several functions are available on the CIV page

Tab/button	Description
	Displays all the votes which are currently open and on which you can vote or submit a comment.
	Displays all the votes which are closed. This tab is only available to Vote Owners and Administrators.
	The Add button is used to create a new vote. The Add button is only available to Vote Owners and Administrators.
	The function Group by can be used to group votes by Technical Bodies or by End Date.

Tab/button	Description
	<p>The columns Reference, Management Body (= Technical Body) and End Date can be filtered.</p> <p>Filters can only be applied to one column at a time.</p>

3.2 Accessing closed votes

Closed votes are only accessible for Vote Owners and Administrators. They can be accessed via the “closed” tab.

From the search screen, it is possible to click either on the **voting button** or on the **editing button**. According to the roles, the view will be different:

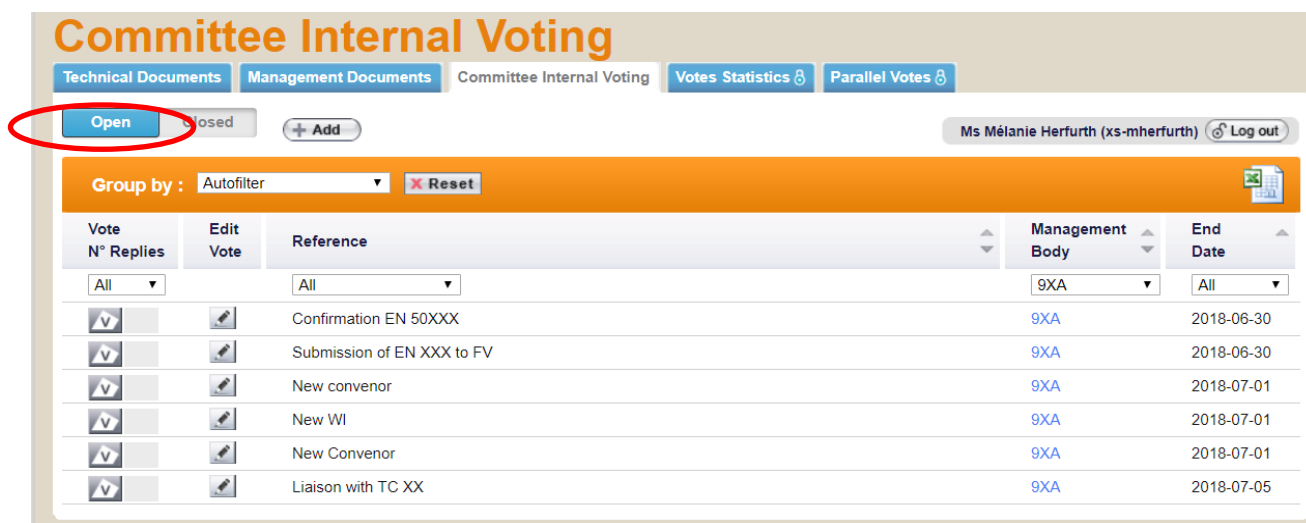


Figure 12 – Open vote details

The system proposes by default a 1-month duration for the vote, but you are free to modify it.

The fields marked with an asterisk * are mandatory and must be filled in.

There are no patterns or naming conventions imposed for any of these fields.

Note that you can edit the metadata at any time after the vote has been created.

Vote Reference	Vote reference or document title.
Vote Title	Title of the vote
Opening date	Vote opening date Note: When creating the vote, the opening date should always be in the future. If today's date is chosen, it will not be possible to configure the questionnaire as the status of the vote will be "Open".
Closing date	Vote closing date
Document hyperlink	Field that can be used to add a hyperlink to a document, e.g. on Collaboration Tool.
Notes	Any notes relevant to the vote.
Comment Type	Online comments are to be filled in directly in the vote whereas with the File attachment option the Voter/Commenter has to upload a comment file. Note: The comment type is chosen when entering the metadata and defines the type of comments for all the questions in one vote.

When you have filled in all compulsory metadata, click the **Save** button.



Click on the **save button** each time you modify/update the metadata (e.g. change of opening date).

Step 2 – Questions & Answers

This step is to define the set of questions and answers for the vote.

Note: When creating the vote, the opening date should always be in the future. If today's date is chosen, it will not be possible to configure the questionnaire as the status of the vote will be "Open". It is not possible to modify the questionnaire of a vote with a status "Open".

The numbering of questions is a free field. The system does not warn you if you use twice the same number or if you skip a number.

❖ Define answers

- Define a possible answer by selecting answers from the dropdown list.
- For each answer, you can select if no **comment** is allowed, if a comment is compulsory or if a comment is optional by selecting one of the option in the drop-down list at the right of the answer.
- To delete an answer, reset the dropdown list of the corresponding answer to **Select** (- Select -).

Some information about the different types of comment options available:

Comment options	Description
No comment allowed	Voter cannot add comment on selected answer.
Comment optional	Voter can add comment on selected answer.
Comment required (HTML window)	Voter must add a comment to selected answer. Comment option include HTML window only.
Comment required (using commenting template)	Voter must add a comment using the commenting template. Comment option include document upload only.

It is possible to choose pre-selected answers, but there is also the possibility to choose "Free Response". The free response is an editable field in which the user can type or paste free text.

The free response field is limited to 4000 characters (more or less a word page).

When the questions and answers are defined, click on **Save**.

- To reset a question, click on **Reset**
- To delete a question, click on the cross () of the corresponding question.

5 Editing existing Votes

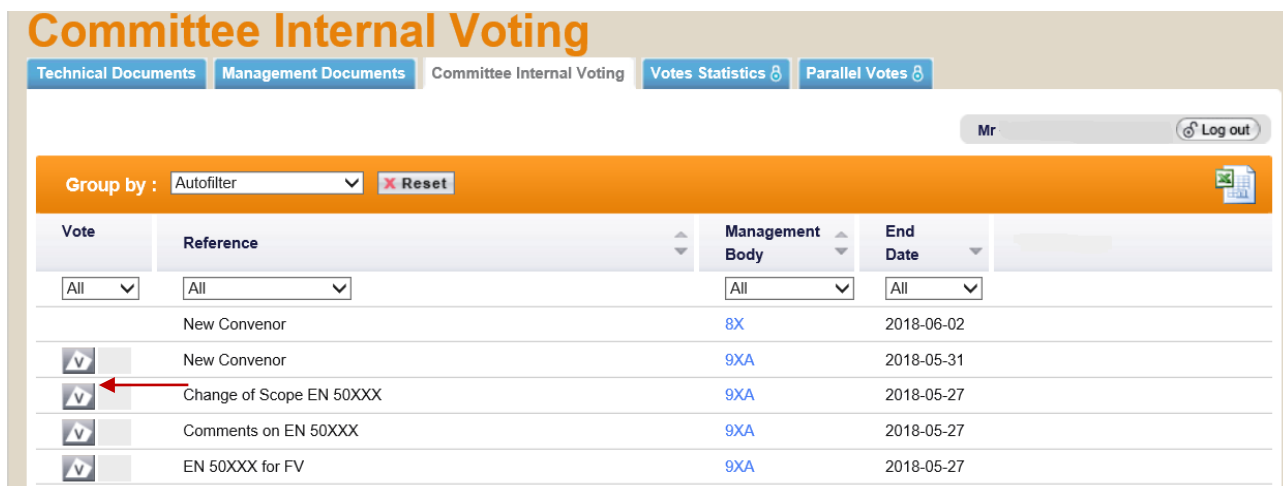

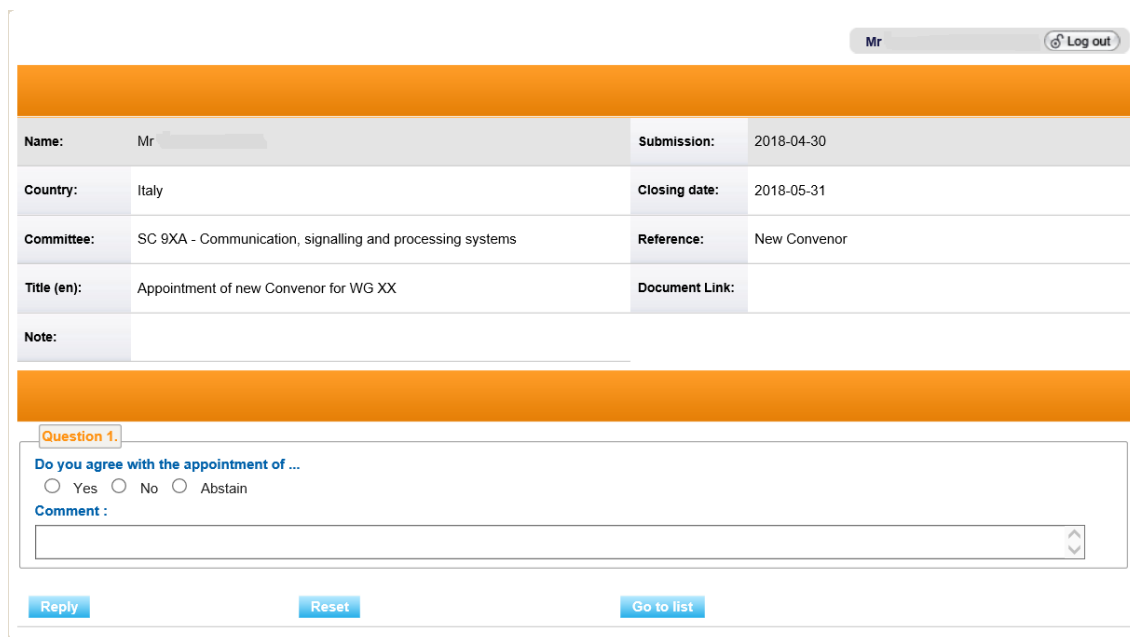

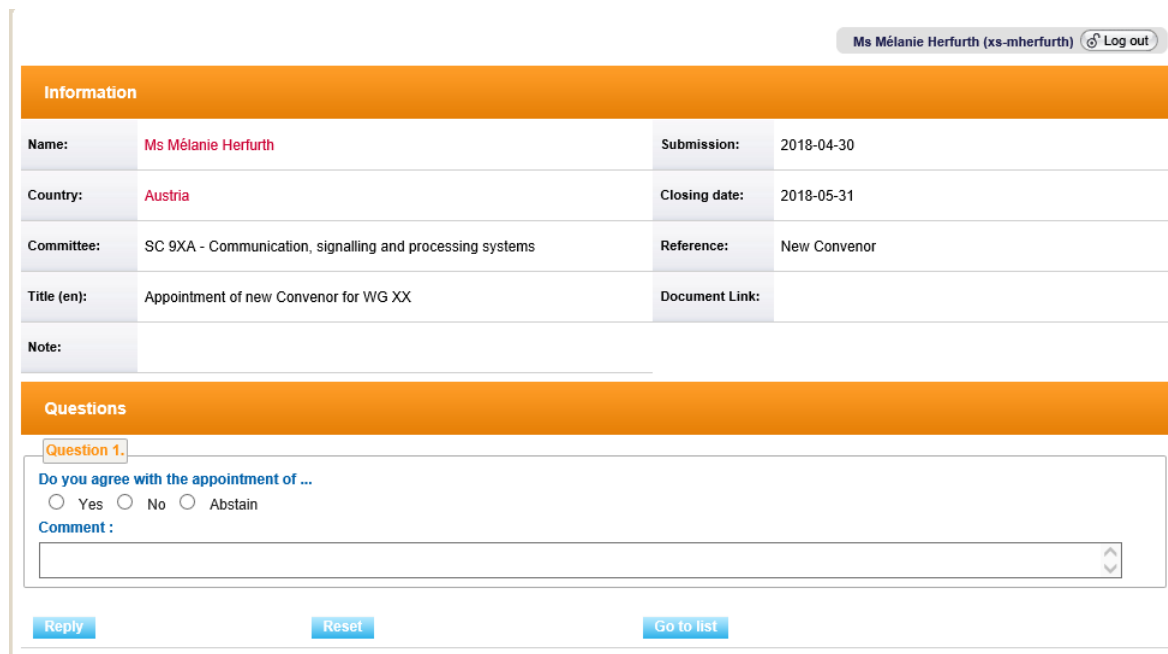

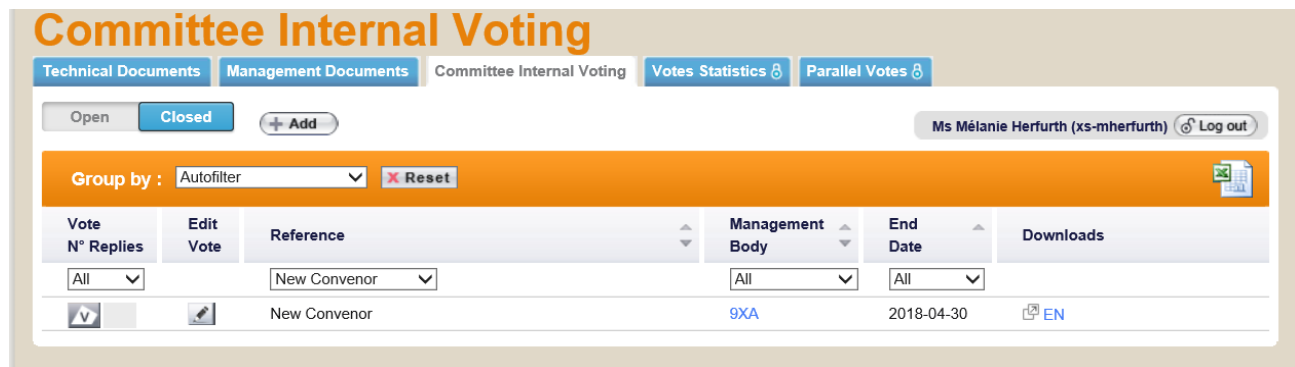


Figure 47 – List of closed votes
